The Vicar's Voice

A TIME FOR EVERY PURPOSE.

I enjoy watching old films, and have quite a collection at home now, ranging from classics such as "From Here to Eternity" with Robert Mitchum and Deborah Kerr, to "Casablanca", because anything with Humphrey Bogart in is priceless in my book! And if they happen to be in black and white, then that makes it seem all the more "classic".

One such film I enjoy is "The Time Machine", (the original version) based on the book by H.G. Wells. It is about a man who, obsessed with the idea of moving about in time, builds himself a time machine, and proceeds, to the bewilderment and disbelief of his friends, to move forward in time. He travels from the year 1900 through the horrors of two world wars, through the nuclear destruction of the planet onto a world where, whilst there is peace and harmony, knowledge is of no importance, no one looks out for anyone else, the days just pass in "nothingness" and survival is a matter of chance.

NEW RECORDER FOR RENDLESHAM

Following the retirement of Ros Thomas, the Suffolk Local History Council has appointed a new Local History Recorder for Rendlesham.

David Edwards, a resident of the village since 2006, has taken up the voluntary position. A former Head of Operations at Aldeburgh Music, and the author of the official history of Snape Maltings Concert Hall, The House that Britten Built, he explained his role: "The main responsibility of the Recorder is to write an annual report for the Local History Council on everything that has happened over the past year in the village, which will become an invaluable resource for future historians." However, David is also interested in finding out more about the history of the village, particularly during the occupation of the Americans at the airbase, and the period following their departure from Suffolk. The planning meetings are monthy and last around 2 hours and usually include chocolate of some sort to help the creative flow.



The UK's active current support of new exploitation of fossil fuels – for example, the UK shale gas fracking

industry, the expansion of its North Sea oil and gas fields, the expansion of airports ...– is beyond absurd."

Consultation launches on the county's Green Access Strategy

Communities are being invited to have their say on the Green Access Strategy - Rights of Way Improvement Plan as part of a tenweek consultation held by Suffolk County Council (SCC).

The county council, under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act (2000) is required to put together this plan which identifies changes that will improve rights of way provision for walkers, cyclists, horse riders and those with mobility problems.

The plan, which looks at rights of way access up until 2026, details why green access is so relevant to Suffolk's population and its visitors, and it focuses on how green access can benefit quality of life. SCC built the strategy on previous work, research and engagement with a range of consultees, such as the Suffolk Local Access Forum, parish councils, local businesses, landowners, users and nonuser groups.

The public consultation opened on the 8th July 2019 and runs until Friday 20th September. The consultation will provide the council with final feedback before the plan is presented to cabinet later this year.

Councillor Mary Evans, Suffolk County Council's Cabinet Member for Highways, Transport and Rural Issues said;

"The Green Access Strategy represents our commitment as a council to make the very most of the rights of way network and to provide our residents, our business community and our visitors an array of different and innovative opportunities to use, enjoy and benefit from green access."

Waldringfield's Scattered Orchard and other delights

On a cool damp day mid May four Rendlesham residents were guests of Greener Waldringfield, the object of our visit being to see their "Scattered Orchard" project with a view, perhaps, to setting up something similar in Rendlesham. After being welcomed with coffee and before beginning our guided walk round the village, we were given an introductory talk outlining how the scheme came into being, where it is going in the future, and what other projects are happening. More details can be obtained on the Greener Waldringfield website, but to summarise briefly, "Scattered Orchards" began in early 2012 with the planting of more than 40 trees, the target being to plant 60 mixed fruit trees to celebrate the Queen's Golden Jubilee, using as many traditional East Anglian varieties as possible. Groups of these trees have been established in various locations on land accessible to the public, and village residents and visitors are encouraged to pick the ripe fruit.

Waldringfield has a Wildlife Group which, since 2007, has been working with the parish council and local residents to make the roadside verges more attractive to humans and wildlife, and we were able to see some of the splendid results during our walk.

We were also taken to view Church Field which had once been used for growing potatoes and was

gifted to the village by Dr Tom Waller, for recreational use. The area covers 5.2 acres, with a beautiful view of the river, and has been largely left for Nature to colonise, apart from an open shortgrass space which is maintained for ball games and kite flying.

We concluded our walk with a visit to the local school which has a well-stocked fruit and vegetable garden and its own woodland area, planted 20 years ago around the perimeter of the school grounds. The trees have now matured and the children are able to play there and learn about the natural world under the watchful eye of their Forest Teacher.

It was a really inspirational experience. So much has been achieved by teams of enthusiastic volunteers, with support from other agencies with links to conservation, and from private individuals too, and we are most grateful to the people from Greener Waldringfield who so generously gave up their Saturday morning.

Childrens Funeral Fund -Stakeholder Briefing

Earlier this year the Prime Minister announced the establishment of a Children's Funeral Fund for England (CFF). Under the scheme, bereaved parents, guardians or carers will no longer pay the fees charged for a cremation or burial of a child under the age of 18, or certain associated expenses.

Fees and expenses will be met instead by government funding with providers (burial/cremation authorities and funeral directors), in the main, claiming from the CFF the fees and expenses they would have otherwise charged to families.

The scheme is due to come into effect on 23rd July 2019



Questioning God's Love






