#### Swords of Kingdoms: The Staffordshire Hoard at Sutton Hoo



Some of the items from the Staffordshire Hoard and several of the objects pictured are coming on loan © Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery

This temporary exhibition will see a total of 65 objects, 62 of those being original Anglo-Saxon objects, coming to Sutton Hoo from Birmingham and the Potteries Museums and Art Galleries (representing the Staffordshire Hoard as one entity), Norwich Castle Museum and Art Gallery and the British Museum. This is the first time that objects from the Staffordshire Hoard will be going on display in the region and so should be a big pull for visitors not only locally, but also further afield in seeing such a collection brought together and on display at Sutton Hoo. Our goal is to ensure that those most vulnerable to the effects of climate change are properly supported and protected.


#### **Buildings**

Our goal is to encourage and support other entities emergency.




Our goal is to restore nature to help drawdown carbon pollution from the atmosphere and to ensure everyone has access to nature in nearby green spaces.

#### Swords of Kingdoms: The Staffordshire Hoard at Sutton Hoo

#### Continued from front page

As a very brief introduction to the Staffordshire Hoard, it was discovered in a field near Lichfield in 2009 and is the largest Anglo-Saxon hoard of gold and silver metalwork ever found. When news broke in 2009, I would have just been starting university and I remember my Dad (who is a real history and Anglo-Saxon enthusiast, and also from Staffordshire) highlighting it to me as a notable find closer to home... and then as they say the rest is history! Whilst I can't say that it was this discovery alone that set me on an early medieval path it was certainly a contributing factor.

The assemblage is thought to of been placed in the ground between c.650-675, although collected together earlier c.600-650 so contemporary with Sutton Hoo. In fact due to shared signature details, many think objects from the Staffordshire Hoard could have been made in the same royal East Anglian workshops as some of the objects from Sutton Hoo. This will be explored in the exhibition, which is being guest curated by Chris Fern. Chris is an independent academic and familiar with both sites having edited the archaeological report on the 2000 excavation here at Sutton Hoo and is also one of the editors of new volume 'The Staffordshire Hoard: An Anglo-Saxon Treasure.'

The majority of the loaned objects will be coming from the Staffordshire Hoard, but also rather excitingly the objects from the British Museum are predominantly finds from Mound One. Even sat here writing this, a slight shiver is going up my spine in knowing that one of the shoulder clasps, the sword pyramids and several other objects will be returning back to the site where they were discovered nearly 81 years ago.

News of the exhibition is starting to be picked up by the press and shared wider, and please do speak about this exhibition with visitors in encouraging those repeat visits to come and experience this unique opportunity later on in the year. How to tell the 'TV Licence' email is fake

- Check for spelling and grammar.
- Check the sender's email address. Real emails from TV Licensing will only come from donotreply@tvlicensing.co.uk.
- TV Licensing will always address you by name as they'll have you on record. A good way to spot a scam is that scammers will often address you with a generic term like 'customer'.

The real website address is <a href="www.tvlicensing.co.uk">www.tvlicensing.co.uk</a>. Scammers do their best to replicate the link but there will always be one detail different, perhaps an inserted dash or one change of letter.

If you're unsure, contact TV Licensing directly by looking up their details separately. Do not click on any links or call any numbers contained in a suspicious email.



# Transition Woodbridge helps local Greengrocers with Borrow Bags

"A typical single-use plastic bag is used for around 11 minutes, yet it's estimated to take over 450 years to break down."

Due to Woodbridge residents' aspirations to move away from plastic bags, Transition Woodbridge is helping Woodbridge Greengrocers remove singleuse plastic bags for their customers and will be encouraging them instead to bring their own reusable bag.

However, as customers, we all have times when we forget to bring our own bag. Sometimes we can manage with no bag at all, juggling all the way home, but if it's raining or we're not great jugglers, it can be difficult to refuse a single-use plastic bag.

Don't panic! In case of 'bag emergencies', Woodbridge Greengrocers and Transition Woodbridge have teamed up to ensure customers can borrow a Transition Woodbridge 'Borrow Bag', which they then return to the shop on their next visit "in the state you would wish to receive it in".

Borrow Bags are free to borrow. They have been made from unwanted, unusable cotton or polycotton material, therefore reducing waste to landfill and upcycling waste into a useful product. All bags are made by a group of fantastic volunteers, with inspiration from Fiona and her team at Fiona's Fabric, Gobbitt's Yard and the Felixstowe Borrow Bag scheme launched in 2018.

Charlie Zakss, of Transition Woodbridge, said "It's great to be able to help local Woodbridge businesses embrace the Transition Woodbridge ethos, it's been hard work making all the bags but it will be very satisfying to see our bags in local residents hands around Woodbridge and know we're all making a difference"

Chris Harrold, of Woodbridge Greengrocers, said "one of the best things about a local greengrocer is that customers can buy 90% of their fruit and vegetables unwrapped and plastic free. If we then put customer's produce in a plastic bag at the checkout, it goes against some of the environmental saving. With Transition Woodbridge's help we hope to get rid of all plastic carrier bags used in the greengrocers, and they have helped us think about our other plastic use – for example we've now moved to 'naked' cut flowers, which takes another chunk of single-use plastic out of circulation"

The kinds of goods offered range from loose-leaf tea, rice, oats, chocolate and other dried foods through to household cleaning products. The Directory has been collated by the Suffolk Waste Partnership with input from Greenprint's Plastic Action Champion volunteers.
