My dear friends,

Growing old (dis)gracefully?

By the time you read this I will have celebrated my 60th birthday. The years seem to have gone by quickly but I am thankful for a very happy and fulfilling family life, and for being able to live out the calling from God, which I felt from early childhood, for the last thirty-five years. Of course, like all of us, I also have regrets, things I wish I had done differently, as well as on-going concerns, but I am confident that God loves, forgives and guides us.

Life expectancy has increased in developed countries and most of us can hope for many years of retirement. In my calling, I am aware that death can come prematurely, sometimes tragically so, with all the pain that involves for the bereaved. We do well to remember that in many parts of the world life can be much more precarious.

I sometimes wonder if we have focused too much on quantity and not enough on quality of life. Our pressured NHS is a victim of its own success! Extreme old age can bring many pains and limitations and, in one of the richest countries in the world, it concerns me that we seem to be unable or unwilling to provide the care which elderly people need in the community. I am personally aware of how difficult this can be, having 89-year-old father 300 miles away, who is now in residential care. Our culture seems to value youth and beauty. I understand that some other cultures show greater respect and care for the elderly, even if it was somewhat sobering when our son's Thai girlfriend told us that she shows so much care to Christine and me because we are old!

Two of my favourite older Biblical characters are Simeon and Anna – Luke 2, 25-38 – who had spent many years seeking God prayerfully and being guided by the Holy Spirit. Thus, they were able to recognise Jesus as the infant Messiah when he came to the Temple, and Simeon to utter what we call the Nunc Dimittis, said or sung at Evening Prayer and Compline, and having many beautiful musical settings.

May God help us grow in wisdom throughout our lives.



ASTRONOMERS WEEK AT HAW WOOD FARM

4th—11th October 2018 Astronomers Week

This year will see a dedicated week for several local astronomical societies to enjoy the dark skies at Haw Wood Farm.

Haw Wood Farm has been named a 'Dark Sky Discovery Site' due to its unusual lack of light pollution.

They have naked eye visibility 5.73, averted 5.99 and a best SQM reading of 21.75.

Very few areas of the UK have this award which makes us the perfect place to combine a weekend break with some top quality star gazing.

Haw Wood Farm welcomes both visual astronomers and imagers but we will try to keep the two in different areas of the site to avoid any issues with light pollution .

The site will be bookable by phone or email only so we know everyone is aware and part of the event.

October 12th and 13th 2018 Outreach Star Party

This year at Haw Wood Farm we are hosting an exciting Outreach Star Party. This is aimed at all

budding astronomers and those who would like to spend a few nights learning about the night sky while enjoying a relaxed weekend camping. We will have astronomy based crafts, quizzes, talks, slide shows and an Introduction to the Night Sky led by David Murton of the Orwell Astronomical Society.

This is an ideal family adventure for young and older children to enjoy.

The Orwell astronomical society will be hosting our tour of the Night Sky and will also be available for guests without telescopes to view through their collection of magnificent scopes.

The Star Parties are a gathering of both expert astronomists, those with an interest in learning a little more and those who simply want to sit back and gaze at the beauty of the night sky.

Because of the nature of the event all lighting on the park will be down to a minimum level or off altogether. We ask anyone participating in this weekend to be aware that to observe the stars at their best ,bright lights and torches should be avoided around the observation area.

Launch of the Rendlesham 'Clean Sweep' campaign

NOBODY who watched David Attenborough's brilliant Blue Planet series can fail to have been moved by the plight of so much of the world's marine life at the hand of mankind - seabirds, dolphins, seals and whales with plastic attached to their extremities, fish that have digested plastic bags, which then finds its way back into the food chain. None of us know the long-term impact it will have on our health, but we all understand that it cannot be good for any of us to eat a fish that has digested plastic.

In the days after the series was screened many of us spoke about how horrified we were - most especially because what is being done to these magnificent creatures is entirely preventable. Thousands of tons of plastic rubbish is being thrown into the world's oceans. While vast quantities of the material is eaten by sea creatures, or causing them to die in agony, much of it is washed up on our beaches creating the most dreadful eyesores. And those of us who take our families to the beach are appalled by what we find there - bottles, bags, cigarette ends, cans, crisp packets, takeaway cartons.

Does any of this sound familiar?

We all live in Rendlesham, a beautiful rural community surrounded by gorgeous countryside. Jubilee Park is magnificent, a well-kept area where our children can play football or basketball or where so many of us can walk our dogs or exercise. There are plenty of litter and dog bins around the perimeter.

Or what about the shopping area? The general store, the hairdresser, the vet, the Chinese takeaway and The Boardwalk Cafe, where the owners are taking extraordinary steps to create something the community can be proud of. As householders we all take pride in our gardens, keeping the grass short, tending to plants and flowers.

And yet...nobody who lives in this community can fail to have been taken aback by the rubbish that is routinely discarded, most especially close to the general store and in the bushes nearby. Bottles, bags, cigarette ends, cans, crisp packets, takeaway cartons.

So what is the solution? Do we turn the other way and hope that somebody else will come along and pick it all up? When we see rubbish being discarded, do we challenge the culprits? We should do - dropping litter is a criminal offence. And just as bottles, bags, cigarette ends, cans, crisp packets and takeaway cartons do not degrade in the world's oceans, neither will they break down if left in a bush, on a path or in the gutter.

Dog owners now pick up after their animals without a second thought. So why is it that so many people still believe it is acceptable to throw a beer bottle into a hedge? Why do our children throw crisp and sweet packets on the ground? And why do so many smokers toss cigarette ends out of car windows or drop their discarded cigarettes on the pavement. Litter bins are located around Rendlesham for a reason and it is up to us to use them and to encourage others to do so too.

We believe that everybody who lives in Rendlesham has a responsibility to keep the area clean. Too many of us have turned a blind eye to the litter problem for too long and that is why we are launching "The Rendlesham Clean Sweep", a concerted a campaign to get litter off our streets and into litter bins. As you walk around the village you will be aware of signs asking you to either take your litter home or to put it in the nearest bin. Please take note of these signs and act upon them.

We want to put the village on the map for the right reasons, and we hope that you will help us to do so.





Suffolk Constabulary announces its blueprint for the future of community policing

Suffolk Constabulary is looking to increase the number of police constables in its Safer Neighbourhood Teams to 159 – an increase of 97 PCs compared to the current structure which has 62. There will also be an extra seven sergeants put into SNTs.

This would be part of a transition which would see 81 full-time equivalent Police Community Support Officer posts being put at risk of redundancy as we seek to reduce the number to 48 FTEs.

Although the current number of PCSOs is 81 FTEs the budgeted number is 107. However, to keep the number of PCSOs at risk of redundancy to a minimum, posts which have become vacant since 2017 have not been filled.

27 PCSOs will work in a new link officer role – they will work with partner agencies in problem-solving initiatives.

Three schools' PCSOs will remain, as we are aiming to provide 18 match-funded and full-funded PCSOs (match funded allows an organisation or business association to split the cost of a PCSO with the constabulary.

The remaining police officers being moved to SNTs will come from a restructuring in other areas.

The increase of 97 PCs and seven sergeants will allow for better flexibility of workforce and increased capability to deal with peaks in demand (i.e. major incidents, events terrorism).

Police officers have warranted powers/ability to investigate crime/deal with disorder.


There will be improvements to investigative structure with more localised investigation.

Safer Neighbourhood Teams work closely with partner agencies to address the issues identified as priorities by the local community. The number of SNTs will remain the same at 18.

Three Neighbourhood Partnership Teams will conduct preventative work and forge close links with partners by being locally-focussed.

A Serious Crime Disruption team will widen its focus to address high threat and harm issues including sexual violence, exploitation and the supply of controlled drugs.

Community

In last month's newsletter we talked about the benefits of composting and in particular whether a communal composting scheme could be viable for us here in Rendlesham. At the time of writing this, the Parish Council are awaiting to see if any volunteers come forward to assess the viability of such a scheme. However, that aside the option of composting is not limited to a communal scheme and is something that can be achieved in most homes. Whilst I considered putting together a useful guide it was clear that I would be unable to do justice on what guides already exists. Having spoken to the Royal Horticultural Society, they were happy that we include their own guide within our newsletter which I hope you all enjoy and maybe even become inspired to do in your home.

Composting

Home composting is the most environmentallyfriendly way of dealing with kitchen and garden waste, plus it produces compost that can be used as an excellent soil improver.

Suitable for...

Composting is useful in all gardens. Only in the very smallest gardens will it be difficult to find space for a compost heap and material to fill it. Owners of such small plots could consider worm composting instead. Although councils offer green waste collections, the RHS encourages home composting because it does not involve heavy transport, with its associated environmental costs. When to compost Composting is done all year, as and when suitable materials are generated in the garden or home. However late summer to early winter is the peak time for making compost.

How to compost

The site and container

It is important that the site is not subjected to extremes of temperature and moisture, as the microorganisms (bacteria and fungi) that convert the waste to compost work best in constant conditions. Position the bin in light shade or shade; it is often more convenient to use a shady area of the garden. An earth base allows drainage and access to soil organisms, but if you have to compost on a hard surface, then add a spadeful of soil to the compost bin.

Bins retain some warmth and moisture and make better compost more quickly, but even an open heap (not enclosed in a bin) will compost eventually. Any of the compost bins on the market should produce compost as long as they exclude rain, retain some warmth, allow drainage and let in air.

Bins less than 1 cubic m (1.3 cubic yd) in size are much less effective than larger ones.

Getting the right balance of composting materials

- Aim for between 25 and 50 percent soft green materials (e.g. grass clippings, annual weeds, vegetable kitchen waste, or manure) to feed the micro-organisms
- The remainder should be woody brown material (e.g. prunings, wood chippings, paper, cardboard, straw or dead leaves)

The bacteria and micro-organisms that produce the compost function best when the balance of green and brown materials is correct.

Avoid letting any one material dominate the heap especially grass clippings, as these can become a slimy, smelly mess on their own.



Composting

Kitchen waste and grass clippings are best mixed with brown woody material, as they tend to be wet and easily compacted, excluding air.

Some common composting materials

- Green: Grass clippings; soft, leafy plants including annual weeds; fruit and vegetables, uncooked kitchen waste; selected pet waste/ bedding
- Brown: prunings and hedge trimmings (ideally shredded), woodchip, leaves, paper and card (torn up or shredded), straw, plant stems
- Accelerators and activators: Products such as 'Garotta' are sometimes added where green waste is in short supply. They contain high levels of nitrogen (a nutrient found in green waste), but should not be necessary if green waste is plentiful. It is also possible to purchase activators containing carbon (a nutrient found in brown woody waste); these are aimed at composting grass clippings or other green waste where there is insufficient brown waste
- Lime: People sometimes think you need to add lime to the compost heap, but there is no need to do so

Turning the heap

Turning the heap adds air; air is necessary for composting to occur. If the heap is too wet or becomes compacted, then the composting process is slower as less air is available.

Ideally, place a lot of composting materials on the heap in one go, and turn it periodically (perhaps every month) to introduce air. Failure to turn the heap is probably the main cause of poor results. Many gardeners are unable to fill the heap in one go, as they accumulate waste gradually. Because of this, home-made compost is seldom as perfect as municipal compost, but it is still effective. Remember to keep the heap moist in dry weather – turning will give you an opportunity to assess the moisture level.

When is the compost ready?

Garden compost can take between six months and two years to reach maturity. Mature compost will be dark brown, with a crumbly soil-like texture and a smell resembling damp woodland.

It is unlikely that all the material in the heap will be like this, but any remaining un-rotted material can be added to the next batch of composting materials.



Problems

Sometimes the results of composting are not as expected.

- Wet, slimy and strong-smelling compost: Too little air and too much water are often to blame. Cover the heap to protect against rain and add more brown waste, such as chopped woody material, shredded woodchip, straw or paper.
- Dry and fibrous with little rotting: Usually caused by too little moisture and too much brown material. Add more green waste, or try a commercial activator or accelerator such as 'Garotta'. Alternatively, add fresh manure at one bucket for every 15cm (6in) layer of compost, fish, blood and bone fertiliser at 270g (9oz) per 15cm (6in) layer of compost, or sulphate of ammonia fertiliser at 140g (5oz) per 15cm (6in) layer of compost.
- Flies: Well-run compost bins don't produce swarms of flies, but if you do see these, then make sure you cover kitchen waste with garden waste after adding it to the heap and check that moisture levels are not too high, causing insufficient air in the heap.

What's on at Woodbridge Library...



Tuesday 18 September @ 12.45pm A reading of Edward FitzGerald's The Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam

Most people know that a Woodbridge Society blue plaque on a house in Pytches Road bears the name of Edward FitzGerald and that the initials EFG are carved on a stone high up on a house on Market Hill. But why is FitzGerald one of Woodbridge's most welcome drink. You will have the opportunity to historically famous residents?

The answer can be found at the Library on **Tuesday** 18 September when Charles Mugleston will introduce and then read FitzGerald's poem The Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam. The reading will begin at **12.45pm** so come and spend a very different lunchtime in the presence of a piece of worldfamous poetry. Entry is free.

FitzGerald was born in Bredfield in 1809. He studied at Trinity College, Cambridge and was then fortunate enough to inherit wealth sufficient to enable him to live a quiet life focused on literature. He was introduced to some ancient Persian poetry in the 1850s which he translated and published as The Rubaiyat of Omar Khayyam. Gradually the poem became famous, so much so that it is the one work by which FitzGerald is now known throughout the world.

Charles Mugleston was born in Ipswich in 1954. His interest in drama was kindled at school and through local dramatic and operatic societies. He has had a professional career on the stage giving re-creations of Charles Dickens' public readings. In 2009 he formed the Omar Khayyam Theatre Company.

The Volunteer of the Year award was presented to John Sones, who is a Community Fire Volunteer. John has been supporting events, carrying out




community safety work across Suffolk, making homes visits to install smoke alarms and advising people how to keep their property safe.

Consumer Corner: Food Allergies

Advice from the Food Standards Agency: Food allergies happen when the immune system – the body's defence against infection – mistakenly treats proteins found in food as a threat. These

proteins are known as allergens.

As a result, a number of chemicals are released by our bodies. It's these chemicals that cause the symptoms of an allergic reaction.

In the UK, food businesses must tell you if they use any of the 14 key allergens as ingredients in the food and drink they provide.

Food businesses include restaurants, cafés and takeaways, and businesses that produce, manufacture or pre-pack food.

The 14 allergens that they need to declare are:

- celery
- cereals containing gluten including wheat, rye, barley and oats
- crustaceans such as prawns, crabs and lobsters
- eggs
- fish
- lupin
- milk
- molluscs such as mussels and oysters

- mustard
- tree nuts including almonds, hazelnuts, walnuts, brazil nuts, cashews, pecans, pistachios and macadamia nuts
- peanuts
- sesame seeds
- soybeans

sulphur dioxide and sulphites (if they are at a concentration of more than ten parts per million) Almost any food can cause an allergic reaction but, there are certain foods that are responsible for most food allergies. The 14 allergens are on the regulatory list because they have been identified as the most common in the UK. If you ask for allergen information and the staff cannot provide it, speak to the manager of the food business or the chef. If you are still not given enough information to help you, you can report them: https://www.food.gov.uk/contact/consumers/report-problem.

If you are not confident in the information you have been provided, it is better not to eat at the premises.






