

# Rendlesham Church



My dear friends,

#### Just the worst time of year for a journey\*

By the time you read this, Christmas will be a distant memory. Yet in the Church's year, it starts on Christmas Day, lasts twelve days, and culminates with Epiphany on 6<sup>th</sup> January, a separate celebration of the visit of the three wise men to the infant Christ. (Matthew 2, 1-12) Nonetheless, as I write in early December, a splendid tableau, made by our Wednesday Club children, has just appeared in Orford Church, depicting this scene. There are holes where Mary and Joseph's faces would be, and a caption:

'Would you, could you, be brave enough to be in their places?' I would like to extend this by asking whether we would be brave enough to be in the places of the wise men?

For also as I write, Parliament is debating the Prime Minister's 'Brexit' agreement. The way ahead seems uncertain, and it is difficult to predict where things will have got to by the time you read it. Like the Biblical Wise Men, we are on a journey to an unknown destination, and not sure how it will affect us. How much we need both wise leaders, but also to 'put ourselves in the place of wise people', by seeking God's wisdom, guidance and light for ourselves, each other, and our nation. Like the wise

men's journey, ours may be a difficult one. T. S. Eliot's poem 'Journey of the Magi'\* describes the challenges of their journey, but also recounts its strange and unexpected end, an encounter with the baby Jesus which left them changed long after their return.

It is not for me as a Christian Priest to share details of my political views. I do believe I have a responsibility to speak into the situation the Good News of a Lord who desires for all people unity and the healing of division co-operation rather than individualism love for all our neighbours both here and overseas the wellbeing and flourishing of all people peace within and between nations justice and a particular concern for the poor, vulnerable and marginalised, as taught by the Old Testament Prophets and shown by Jesus himself.

A prayer written by The Very Revd Andrew Nunn, Dean of Southwark Cathedral:

God of reconciling hope,
as you guided your people in the past,
guide us through the turmoil of the present time,
and bring us to that place of flourishing where
our unity can be restored, the common good served,
and all shall be made well.
In the name of Jesus we pray. Amen.







# Consumer Corner: Register your new appliances



If you have any new appliances this Christmas/ New Year – don't forget to register them!

The average success rate of an electrical product recall in the UK is just 10-20%.

This means that there are potentially millions of recalled electrical items still in UK homes. As most of these products have been recalled because they offer a risk of electric shock or electrical fire, they present a serious risk. One of the most important things to do once you have a new electrical appliance is to register it.

# Sutton Hoo goes on tour

As Sutton Hoo closes to begin major transformation works across the site, we're embarking on a countywide roadshow with our beautiful replicas. If you can't come to Sutton Hoo, Sutton Hoo will come to you!

Sutton Hoo closes at the start of October to start work on our £4million Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) project, 'Releasing the Sutton Hoo Story'.

Plans include building a 17 metre high observation tower to give views over the entire burial ground and to the River Deben beyond.

A new route around the site will allow visitors to walk in the steps of the Anglo-Saxons, tracing part of the route the ship may have taken up towards the Royal Burial Ground.

instigated the dig that would lead to the discoveries, will be transformed and enhanced guided tours, thought-provoking activities and installations, innovative interpretation and creative programming will all sit alongside a school education programme.

# Dog owners are reminded to clear up after their pets!

A Witnesham resident who ignored two Fixed Penalty Notices for failing to clear up after his dog has been made to pay of total of £600 after Suffolk Coastal took him to court.

The Council brought a prosecution against Mr Mason at Ipswich Magistrates' Court. When Mr Mason failed to attend, the court heard the matter in his absence and fined Mr Mason £150 for failing to clear up after his dog on two separate occasions, in Witnesham, Suffolk.

He was also ordered to pay £450 costs.

In April 2018 Council officers were notified of two separate incidents where Mr Mason had failed to clear up after his dog had fouled on public land. Mr Mason received two fixed penalty notices but failed to pay.

Cllr Steve Gallant, Suffolk Coastal Cabinet Member with responsibility for Community Health said:

"Our district is a really dog friendly place and we know that most dog owners are responsible and clear up after their pets.

"There are a small number of inconsiderate people who feel the rules do not apply to them, but there is absolutely no excuse for failing to clear up after your dog.

"We want to ensure that all public areas are safe for everyone to enjoy and will not hesitate to take action against anyone who is found responsible for despoiling our environment."

The council introduced Public Space Protection Orders in January 2018 to tackle dog fouling across the district. Failure to clear up after a dog in your control could result in a fixed penalty notice of £80 being issued. Failure to pay the fixed penalty notice may lead to prosecution and a potential maximum fine of £1000.

Suffolk Coastal has a statutory duty to keep public land clear of litter and refuse, including dog fouling and will take action against irresponsible individuals who fail to clear up after their dogs within a restricted area. Not only is dog fouling highly unpleasant, it is also a hazard to health.

#### **Feel Good Fish Cakes**

Serves 4. Canned fish are high in nutrients.

250g (2 medium) potatoes or

80g packet of instant potato + 300mls (1 mug) water. 1x120g tin sardines/tinned mackerel/pilchards in tomato sauce.

Salt and pepper. A little flour. 1 tbsp. oil. *Optional* 

1 tbsp. mayonnaise or 1 tbsp. Greek yoghurt.

1 tbsp. chopped parsley.

#### **METHOD**

Make mashed potatoes, either from instant only putting in 300mls water (not the 350mls they say for making mash) or cook potatoes in water for 15-20 minutes until soft, drain and mash. Leave the potato to cool before next stage. Put sardines into a bowl and mash. Add mayonnaise or Greek yoghurt and parsley if you have them, it will taste great without. Add the mashed potato and season the mixture with salt and pepper, mix well together. Shape into 4 fish cakes and cover lightly with flour. Leave in fridge for half an hour to firm up. Heat oil and fry for 3-4 minutes on each side on a medium heat until crispy.

The Parish Council is receiving an increasing number of complaints regarding dog fouling in the village. Responsible dog owners clear up after their dogs and dispose of the waste either at home, or in one of the many waste bins provided throughout the village. Failure to clear up after a dog in your control is a criminal offence for which a fixed penalty fine of £80 can be issued. The maximum fine that a court can impose for this offence on conviction is £1,000.

Always make sure you take something with you to pick up your dog's faeces and pay attention to what your dog is doing at all times - not having a doggy bag, or not noticing that the dog has fouled, is no excuse for not clearing up.

Any bin will do!

If there is not a dedicated dog waste bin available, dog waste can be placed in any litter bin.












