Visit Suffolk Easter Extravaganza

The Easter weekend is one of the highlights of the year for many people. First and foremost it is of course a religious holiday, but it is also the first long weekend of spring and carries with it the promise of warmer weather and the opportunity to escape our normal daily routine for a few days.

We have compiled a list of ten things to do over the Easter weekend in Suffolk. Consuming chocolate as you go, is optional...

1. EASTER WEEKEND AT SNAPE MALTINGS There is lots going on at Snape Maltings on the

Suffolk coast over the Easter weekend. The festivities include concerts featuring contemplative music by Bach, Beethoven and Philip Glass; choral music and a family concert.

There is also a **farmers' market**, family activities and an Easter egg hunt.

2. EASTER SPEGGTACULAR AT BAYLHAM HOUSE FARM

If you enjoy cuddling lambs and feeding goats, then Baylham House Rare Breeds Farm is the place to go. Situated not far from Needham Market, the farm has its **annual Easter egg hunt** and lots of farm animals to visit, feed and pet.

3. EASTERTIDE AT KENTWELL HALL

Kentwell Hall in Long Melford is famous for hosting medieval and other historic re-creations. Over the Easter weekend around 100 Tudors will be **celebrating Easter in medieval style**; there will be an "impossible Easter quiz" and the chance to win a huge chocolate egg; a children's Easter Egg Trail and the house, gardens and farm will all be open.

4. BIRDWATCHING FOR BEGINNERS AT MINSMERE

Polish your binoculars and **join a walk** with an RSPB guide on Sunday, 16th April at 10.30am to learn about some of the birds that are to be found at the coastal RSPB nature reserve at this time of year.

5. ANGLO-SAXON GAMES AND VIKING PASTIMES AT WEST STOW

Story-telling and poetry; spear dancing and archery; spinning, weaving and music on the lyre. All of this is to be found at the **West Stow Anglo-Saxon village** near Bury St Edmunds from Saturday, 14th to Monday, 17th April.

6. GUIDED WALKS IN LAVENHAM

Join a **guided tour** around the beautiful village of Lavenham on Easter Saturday at 2.30pm and Sunday at 11am. Visitors can also follow the Lavenham Easter Art Trail to search for works of art that are hidden around the village and vote for their favourite. There are prizes to be won! **7. HUMPTY DUMPTY'S EGGSTRAVAGANZA** **An Easter panto** at the Spa Pavilion Theatre in Felixstowe for the whole family with singing, dancing and lots of egg-selent tales!

Suitable for all ages and especially those aged 4 – 14, who enjoy traditional pantomime and plenty of audience participation.

8. EASTER FUN DAYS AT THE MUSEUM OF EAST ANGLIAN LIFE

The 75 acre site in Stowmarket will be a-buzz with Easter capers as the annual **Easter Fun Days** take place on Easter Sunday and Monday. Feed the lambs, watch the sheepdog demonstrations, join in the Peter Rabbit-themed Easter egg hunt and lots of other family activities.

9. SPRING GO BINGO AT NOWTON PARK

Nowton Park near Bury St Edmunds is a great place to explore at any time of year. With over 200 acres, it has an arboretum with trees from around the world, wild flower meadows, wildlife ponds and the most spectacular display of daffodils (over 100,000 of them at last count!).

A quiz sheet (£1 from the visitor centre) is available for those wanting to add a bit of excitement to their exploration of the park this Easter. Play **Spring Go Bingo** and search out the natural objects on the list to claim a prize.

10. WALKING IN SUFFOLK

If hunting for Easter eggs doesn't really appeal, what about **taking a peaceful walk**through the Suffolk countryside or along the beautiful coast? Pick up a map in one of our tourist information centres and explore Suffolk's two areas of outstanding natural beauty; one of the many nature reserves. or stroll along some of the 3,500 miles of footpaths that are in the county.

Make sure you plan a route which includes **a cosy pub** and stop off for a refreshing glass of Suffolk ale along the way.

£2 million agreed to fund projects across Suffolk

Public sector leaders in Suffolk have agreed a new £2 million fund to support local projects across Suffolk.

The funding, which is equivalent to £500,000 each for West Suffolk, Ipswich, Babergh and Mid Suffolk, and East Suffolk, will support projects that support economic, social and community projects.

Proposals would be initiated, developed and agreed by both the local councils and Suffolk County Council. The work will start soon, with project expected to be agreed and start in 2019/20.

Jennie Jenkins, the independent chair of Suffolk Public Sector Leaders Group, said:

"It is clear from work we've funded from our business rate pool and the Government's 100% pilot that relatively small amounts of money from the public sector can have a significant effect. By creating this specific fund, which will operate under the same arrangements as the 100% business rate retention pilot scheme, we will continue this local growth and benefit communities across Suffolk."

It comes after Suffolk was successful in becoming a pilot area for the Government's 2018/19 100% business rate retention scheme. The additional money, approximately £10 million, is being spent on a variety of economic, social and community projects across Suffolk. These include:

- £1 million towards un-locking the Waterfront Gateway in Ipswich
- £500,000 towards enhanced public realm in Ipswich, including St Peters Dock
- £200,000 to support the Western Way Development in Bury St Edmunds
- £500,000 on expanding social prescribing in West Suffolk
- £200,000 investment around the Delphi site/Newton Road/South Suffolk Business Centre area in Sudbury
- £40,000 for the SMART Grid energy project for the former Sugar Beet site in Sproughton
- £240,000 to assist with the purchase, redevelopment and modernisation of the NatWest Bank in Stowmarket
- £100,000 towards the First Light Festival in Lowestoft
- £500,000 towards supported housing for people with learning disabilities and autism in Lowestoft
- £800,000 towards Woodbridge car parking and drainage

Consumer Corner: Suffolk residents are currently being targeted by scammers pretending to be from HMRC



Beware the new HMRC scam where fraudsters call to say there is an arrest warrant in your name

Suffolk Trading Standards have been receiving a number of calls, as well as messages on their social media channels, that Suffolk residents are currently being targeted by scammers pretending to be from HMRC.

The scammers are phoning victims to say an arrest warrant has been made in their name because of unpaid taxes or outstanding debts.

This is a scam; if you receive a call you should hang up.

As well as phone calls and voicemail, scammers also send emails, texts and even letters trying to trick people into handing over their money or personal details. They usually take the form of 'you're owed a tax rebate' or 'you're in trouble with the HMRC'.

If you receive a call you should report it so no one else falls victim to it, and it can be investigated. You can forward suspicious emails claiming to be from HMRC to <u>phishing@hmrc.gsi.gov.uk</u> and texts to 60599. Or you can contact Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 to report any suspicious calls or you can use their online service.

Film industry generates £3.8 million for Suffolk's economy

Suffolk's economy has benefitted from at least \pounds 3.8 million of additional investment because of work to attract film makers to the county, a new report has revealed today.

Screen Suffolk, an organisation set up in 2016 by councils in the county and funded by the Suffolk Public Sector Leaders group, actively markets hundreds of Suffolk locations to the filmmaking industry, as well as connecting them to local crews, hotels and restaurants and film services.

Research by Screen Suffolk has looked at spend by film production companies and crews during shoots. It estimates that an average filming day will generate at least £11,500 of spend in the local community – equivalent to \pounds 3,864,000 in the first 24 months of operation. Creative England, the government body for film locations in the UK, estimates that crews spend three times this figure - £35,000 a day.

Films and shows shot in Suffolk in the past two years include:

- The Detectorists for BBC 4, shot in Framlingham and Suffolk County Council's headquarters in Ipswich
- Escape to the Country for Channel 4, shot in Sudbury and Wickhambrook
- The Child in Time for BBC 1, shot in Shingle Street
- Countryfile for BBC 1, shot in Walberswick
- Landscape Artist of the Year for Sky Arts, shot in Felixstowe at Landguard Point
- The Crown for Netflix, shot at Elveden Hall
- Fearless for ITV, shot at Bentwaters Park Two major movies were shot in the Suffolk in 2018, including a Richard Curtis/Danny Boyle production in Halesworth and 'The Personal History of David Copperfield', with scenes shot in Bury St Edmunds. £82,000 was spent by crews in Bury St Edmunds, including in hotels, on food and drink and other local services. Both films will be released in 2019 and a significant boost to screen-related tourism in Suffolk is expected.

Screen Suffolk also creates work experience and training opportunities for Suffolk's budding filmmakers.

What do we say when our children refuse to attend school because of our failure to tackle climate change?

The story begins with Greta Thurnberg, a 15 year old Swedish girl, who on 20 August 2018 decided to not attend school until the 2018 Sweden general election on 9 September after heat waves and wildfires in Sweden. Her demands were that the Swedish government reduce carbon emissions as per the Paris Agreement, and she protested via sitting outside the Riksdag every day during school hours with the sign *Skolstrejk för klimatet* (school strike for the climate). After the general elections, she continued to strike only on Fridays, which gained worldwide attention. She inspired school students across the globe to take part in student strikes. As of December 2018, more than 20,000 students held strikes in at least 270 cities. Thunberg credits the teen activists at Parkland school in Florida, who organized the March for our lives, as the inspiration to begin her school climate strike. (Wikipaedia)

Next we come to pupils from around the UK who went "on strike" on Friday 15th February as their part of the rapidly expanding global campaign for action on climate change. Students around the country walked out of schools, between 11:00 am and 2:00 pm to call on the government to declare a climate emergency and take active steps to tackle the problem. Organisers Youth *Strike 4 Climate* said protests took place in more than 60 towns and cities, with an estimated 15,000 taking part. They carried placards, some reading: "There is no planet B."

The biggest protests were held in London, Brighton, Oxford and Exeter, [some students in Suffolk took part], the UK Student Climate Network said that it has four key demands:

1. The government should declare a "climate emergency"

2.It should also inform the public about the seriousness of the situation

3. The national curriculum should be reformed to include "the ecological crisis"

4. The age of voting should be lowered to 16 so younger people can be involved in decision-making around environmental issues.

Greta tweeted about the UK protests, writing: "British PM says that the children on school strike are 'wasting lesson time'. That may well be the case. But then again, political leaders have wasted 30 yrs of inaction. And that is slightly worse."

Now, by the time of this issue of Rendlesham News, there will have been the world wide students' strike held on Friday March 15th.

So what do we say to these students?

The National Association of Head Teachers said it did not condone children missing school to take part in the action and that "nothing is more important than a child's education". It said "individual school leaders can decide how best to respond" to any protests involving its students.

However, energy minister Claire Perry said she was "incredibly proud" of young people's passion and concern. She told the BBC: "I suspect if this was happening 40 years ago, I would be out there too."

Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn said schoolchildren were "right to feel let down by the generation before them", while Green Party MP Caroline Lucas said it was the "most hopeful thing that's happened in years".

The Parish Council is receiving an increasing number of complaints regarding dog fouling in the village. Responsible dog owners clear up after their dogs and dispose of the waste either at home, or in one of the many waste bins provided throughout the village. Failure to clear up after a dog in your control is a criminal offence for which a fixed penalty fine of £80 can be issued. The maximum fine that a court can impose for this offence on conviction is £1,000.

Always make sure you take something with you to pick up your dog's faeces and pay attention to what your dog is doing at all times - not having a doggy bag, or not noticing that the dog has fouled, is no excuse for not clearing up.

Suffolk County Council and Suffolk Coastal District Council are continuing to raise serious concerns around plans for wind farm projects.

Suffolk County Council and Suffolk Coastal District Council are continuing to raise serious concerns around plans for windfarm projects proposed by ScottishPower Renewables, and the lack of coordination with other energy projects proposed on the coast.
