

#### Rendlesham Good Neighbour Scheme goes live!

By the time you are reading this the Rendlesham Good Neighbour Scheme will be live, ready to help you when you need it. For those not aware what a Good Neighbour Scheme is it is where a group of local volunteers try to help out with tasks and assistance when there is no obvious person to ask. If you need a lift to Wickham Surgery because there isn't a slot available at Rendlesham and have no transport then give us a call.

If you need someone to collect medication from the pharmacy because you are incapacitated then that's us.

If you are feeling isolated and just need a chat or to share a cup of tea we are here.

If you need a lift to the hospital for an appointment and can't use the bus or hospital transport then we can help.

Need to change a lightbulb and don't fancy balancing on a wobbly chair, we are ready to assist. Injured yourself and need someone to walk the Dog?

If your relative or friend normally relies on you for their shopping and you are away on holiday then we might be able to step in.

In fact anything that you would normally ask a friend or family member to help with but for whatever reason they cannot, we will try to help.

We have a few ground rules to make it fair to all. We make a small charge for transport of 30p per mile (rounded down to the nearest £) so the volunteer is not out of pocket. Neither are we trying to undercut or replace the local taxi companies – this is not a 'cheap lift to the pub' service!

Call or text us on our number and leave a message



including your name, phone number, and what you need help with and we will return your call with some suggestions or to make arrangements. This is not a manned phone but a message system as we are unable to staff an office but it does mean you can call anytime 24/7 as messages are read at least once daily. Consequently this is not for urgent situations.

All our volunteers are checked out by the Government DBS service and are fully insured as volunteers to help you.

We are also looking to increase the pool of volunteers so if you would like to help your community, meet likeminded people, increase your circle of friends and join us please get in touch through the same phone number. All skills are welcomed from car drivers to chatterboxes, coordinators to dog walkers (it's a great way to increase your daily steps!).


#### Rendlesham Bottle Banks

#### MAY

You may be forgiven in thinking that Easter is all over now, although there may still be the odd uneaten chocolate egg left untouched...but most of the shops will have emptied their shelves from Easter Eggs, fluffy bunnies and chicks and given them over to gardening and barbeque equipment. Summer is coming....and with it the gardening centres and shops are full of growbags, tomato and strawberry plants and all kinds of fruit, vegetables and colourful seeds and plants to enhance the garden and cheer us after the drab grey winter.

"Capel Green (<u>www.capelgreen.co.uk</u>) is a major new feature length documentary about the Rendlesham Forest incident that aims to provide more information to the public than ever released before. With over 50 interviews in both the UK and the USA, Capel Green will reveal new witnesses and new events that include a final confirmation from a direct military witness to a UFO shining a beam down into the nuclear Weapons Storage Area at RAF Bentwaters. #### Rendlesham Village Recorder

For the past six years I have been acting as the Rendlesham Village Recorder, and I am looking for a replacement as I can no longer take part in Village events.

What does the Recorder do? Every December I submit a report on the village for the past year, along with similar Recorders for most villages in Suffolk. That is, I list our achievements, our problems and successes. The December 2018 report, for example, mentioned our wonderful new shop, and the first full year of the Boardwalk Café. I spoke of the housing applications, and our village events. I often add photos, like the scenes when the Theatre and Sports Centre were demolished in previous years. I mention village organisations, and churches, school and medical services. In short, I try to present picture of our growth as a village and all the groups that are adding to our village life.

Village Recorders have another function: they are also collectors of historical photographs and knowledge, and also as collectors of modern ephemera which will in a hundred

years tell future historians more about us. I have collected some of the handbills that come through my door, for example, or agendas for Meetings held by the Parish council. This material is deposited at the Suffolk Record Office for preservation.

Do you think you would like to become the new Recorder? Help is available, and study days are held organised by the Suffolk Local History Council at which you can see the work done by other Recorders. The minimum requirement is for you to write an annual report, which takes a few hours at the end of each year.



## Consumer Corner: Beware of the fraudster

If you're not sure if any letter, email or text you receive is genuine, it's better to do some checking or ask for advice than respond and give your details away to a fraudster...

Suffolk Trading Standards say: A Suffolk resident has received a letter from a company purporting to be a trading association for the solar panel industry, offering the homeowner a 'free solar health checks' or servicing. The letter also indicated that the homeowners' warranty is due to expire. The information contained is false. If you receive unsolicited letters from companies offering free services for your solar panels, we advise you to ignore the letter; if you are concerned contact your original installer or an MCS-accredited installer that is also a member of a consumer body such as Renewable Energy Consumer Code (RECC) or Home Insulation & Energy Systems Contractors Scheme (HIES) for advice. 





#### A RENDLESHAM FORESTER



Drive south or east from Calais in northern France and you cannot fail to see the cemeteries of the Great War. Many by the roadside, some in the middle of fields or farmland sited on the battlefields where the soldiers fell. All beautifully maintained with neatly clipped lawns and bright Portland head stones marking each grave. The Commonwealth War Graves Commission employs local gardeners and landscapers to tend the cemetery's so they remain beautiful and peaceful places to visit, pay respects and to remember. Many visitors cross the channel each year to do just this. Some for the first time, some making a regular pilgrimage to a distant relative or family friend. It was on such a visit that I found myself at the Vis-En-Artois cemetery near Harcourt, Pas-Des-Calais. A friend was looking for the name of a Great Uncle who is commemorated here on one of the stone panels. As a former Rendlesham resident I have researched some of the names on the First World War memorial on the wall of the beautiful parish church of St. Gregory the Great. Thomas William Rogers was of particular interest to me. He was a gardener at Rendlesham Hall at the outbreak of war, the son of Henry and Jane Rogers of Rendlesham Park. The war was well under way by the time Thomas answered the call to the colours and as was usual at that time, soldiers were posted to regiments that needed them and not necessarily to their own county regiments. Thomas was posted to my own county regiment, the Sherwood Foresters (Notts&Derbys) and served with their 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion (one of Kitchener's New Army

battalions) in the 11<sup>th</sup> (Northern) Division. This battalion was heavily involved in the battles of the Hindenburg Line which were some of the actions of the last 100 days of the war in September and October 1918. Thomas was killed in action on 11.10.18. He was 30 years of age and his body was never recovered.



#### **Bentwaters Cold War Museum**

The Bentwaters Cold War Museum will be opening its doors for 2019 on Sunday 7th April and has become a popular attraction for visitors to the Suffolk coastal area and for those interested in aviation and military installations previously denied access to the public.

The museum is based in the United States Air Force (USAF) hardened command post on the former Bentwaters airbase which closed after the withdrawal of the USAF in 1993 and is believed to be the only such building open to the public in the UK and Europe.

Run by volunteers from the Bentwaters Aviation Society, the building is a large bunker made available to the public to view following 3 years of work to renovate and refurbish and opened in 2007. Further information on the society can be found at <a href="https://www.bentwaters-as.org.uk">www.bentwaters-as.org.uk</a> and for the museum at <a href="https://www.bewm.org.uk">www.bewm.org.uk</a>

The main "War Operations Room" and "Battle Cabin" have been restored to original condition including the original decontamination showers and airlocks allowing members of the public to see these once top secret, high security military installations in detail in an eerie atmosphere evoking the Cold War period. Other parts of the building have been turned into exhibition rooms, covering the history of RAF Bentwaters from W.W.II until the base closed in 1993. Included in this are histories of the units that operated from the airfield, particularly the 81st Fighter Wing. Also included is the other airfield which was part of the "twin base" complex - RAF Woodbridge, again covering the period from W.W.II until the present day. Of particular interest to families is a detailed timeline display of the Cold War which has proven of great help to those studying this period at school.

Further exhibition rooms feature information on the "Special Operations/Rescue Squadrons" that were based at RAF Woodbridge, and also the "Aggressor" Squadron based at Bentwaters.

Outside are the aircraft exhibits where the RAF Harrier and Hunter can be seen, and are joined by the USAF A-10 Warthog which was a familiar sight in the skies over Suffolk when this iconic type operated from Bentwaters and Woodbridge.

There is plenty of car parking space and the museum is suitable for all ages and has the added benefit of being an ideal all weather visitor attraction. Plans for 2019 will see airframes continue to undergo work to bring them up to museum standard and it is expected some will be completed by the end of the

year. The café and shop continues to be a great success offering light refreshments and souvenirs and card payment facilities.

Following on from the success of previous years, the open dates for 2019 have now been finalised and the museum will continue to open on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month and Bank Holiday Sundays & Mondays, from April until October.



#### Have you seen a Yellow Fish?







Did you know that road gullies and surface water drains are usually not connected to sewage treatment systems (unlike the drains from our kitchens and bathrooms), but connect straight to our natural water-courses? This means that any rubbish, litter, or waste liquids washed into the surface water drainage system are at risk of polluting streams, rivers, beaches and the ocean, with serious consequences for

aquatic ecosystems and wildlife. "Yellow Fish" is an initiative of the Environment Agency designed to remind people of these facts and encourage greater care when disposing of wastes that commonly end up polluting freshwater and marine habitats, through a clear message of "Only Rain Down the Drain" together with stencilling Yellow Fish symbols by surface water drains to remind people of the link with natural watercourses.



This January, February and March, Groundwork Suffolk have, on behalf of the Greenprint Forum, been trialling a <u>Yellow Fish campaign</u> in Felixstowe, Woodbridge and Lowestoft, engaging with businesses, community groups and residents to raise awareness of the issues and offer advice available via the <u>Suffolk A-Z of recycling</u> about sustainable disposal routes for waste that often end up washed or chucked into gullies, making cigarette end "pocket ashtrays" available to smokers for free at supporting shops and restaurants—and inspiring a big joint litter pick between Groundwork and Kirkley People's Forum in Lowestoft!

At the end of the trial, we will use the findings to determine the feasibility of expanding and/or extending the campaign—so watch this space—and a big "thank you" to all the businesses and community groups who have supported this well-received project.



A wildlife pond big or small can be one of the single best features for attracting new wildlife to, and supporting existing wildlife in, your garden not only including the dragonflies, damselflies, and amphibians that depend on ponds for their complex lifecycles, but can also be important feeding grounds for birds, hedgehogs and bats, and can even be important watering stations for bees.

The Wildlife Trusts and the Royal Horticultural Society have just launched a handy booklet full of advice about how to make a wildlife friendly garden pond as well as ideas of how to help wildlife if a pond isn't going to work for your own garden:

#### **Pot-holes and Cyclists**

Once upon a time we used to hear about pot-hole in the winter, the highway contractor repaired them in the spring and summer and as a consequence there were fewer of them and they were smaller.

Unfortunately this regular cycle of events has stalled, (forgive the pun!) and the consequences are bad for the motorist, and catastrophically dangerous for cyclists. Over the last 10 years at least 22 people have died and a further 368 have been seriously injured by potholes related accidents. Pot-holes are now much more prolific, bigger and to be found in our roads all year round so it is very likely these figures will increase exponentially.

The consequences for the motorist of course are vehicle damage and we hear in the news of the sometimes very expensive repair bills. Cyclists on the other hand are much more vulnerable. While cycles suffer damage in the same way as cars, the riders are much more likely to be injured or even hospitalised.

While drivers drive and damage is covered by insurance albeit inconvenient, cyclists need to adjust their actions in order to protect themselves and their bicycles.

We believe that by sharing and explaining some of the problems from a cyclist's point of view, it will create a greater understanding and make our roads safer for all users.

This article deal with Pot-holes but many of the actions of cyclists relative to pot-holes are common to other dangers cyclists encounter. For example, longitudinal cracking, drop-off's, visibility, verge erosion, agricultural traffic, close passing and dangerous driving.

If a driver comes up behind a cyclist riding in the centre of the vehicle lane, it seems in many cases to incense them. Often what follows is "close passing" regardless of the road conditions or visibility.

The reason cycle riders ride out in the centre of the vehicle lane is not to get in the way of motorists and hold them up, but just simply to avoid the pot-holes. Longitudinal cracking, drop-off's and debris spread on the road by vehicle erosion are also avoided by adopting this tactic. This action also increases the cyclist's visibility. Riding out is particularly important on stretches of roads where hedges have not been cut back and the road is winding.

I do hope that by explaining some of the reasoning behind cyclist's actions a greater understanding and tolerance might emerge.

#### INDONESIA CELEBRATES THE VALUE OF LIBRARIES

A recent newspaper article told the following story. "With 17,000 islands and a geography that almost spans the distance from London to Tehran, Indonesia has struggled to promote reading across the country. For every 100 students, just one quarter leave school meeting the minimum standards of literacy and numeracy. Only 30% of villages have a library; some only stock copies of the Quran...... People argue that lack of interest isn't the problem, it's the lack of infrastructure. In

response, thousands of Indonesians have opened their own library in their own communities. Estimates suggest that there are thousands of such libraries in Indonesia, started by ordinary people with great initiative to address the lack of books in their area and funded by occasional donations. There is the library boat that sails around West Sulawesi. There are libraries on the back of vegetable carts, shelves lugged around by horses in Serang and in West Papua. Across Banten a 200-strong motorbike gang called the Komunitas Motor Literasi (Moli) brings books to homes from a box attached to their vehicles, delivered with the ease of a takeaway.

All of them are run by inventive, ambitious, ordinary people." (Courtesy of The Guardian)

Healthwatch Suffolk's "My Health, Our Future" project highlights troubling statistics surrounding body image, self-harm, exam stress, cyberbullying, and social media use, including the shocking revelation that a quarter of female students aged 16 say they have self-harmed.

Released this month, the full report – which over two years has gathered almost 14,000 responses from people aged 11 to 19 – can be downloaded directly from the Healthwatch Suffolk website at www.healthwatchsuffolk.co.uk.

With every participating school having received a tailored report detailing their student's responses, it is hoped that the findings will continue to drive vital changes in curriculum and policy.
