

Projects and Events

The Council are committed to making Rendlesham a quality place to live. Some of the ongoing projects and events are:

Jubilee Park Master Plan

The results of the extensive Neighbourhood Plan and other Jubilee Park consultations have fed in to the Master Plan which comprises a series of outcomes to be delivered by the Parish Council over the short term, medium term and longer term. These include additional play area equipment, the outdoor gym, 5-a-side football pitch, skatepark, seating to name but a few.

Climate Emergency Action Plan

The development of the Action Plan will provide the blueprint for Parish Council to ensure that the climate and nature restoration goals are at the forefront of their decision making process.

Christmas Lights

The first Christmas Lights display was launched in December 2011 in the village square. Following on from its success it has become an annual event which launches the start of the festive season.

Rendlesham Show

Following on from the hugely successful Diamond Jubilee Celebrations in June 2012, the Parish Council now holds an annual summer show on the second weekend of June each year (Covid permitting).

Santa's Grand Tour

New for 2020, the Tour was a huge success which saw Santa visit every street in the main part of the village in his sleigh.

Teddy Bear's Picnic

New for 2020 the picnic took place on a lovely summer's day and was another Covid safe event supported by Rendlesham Community Radio to bring some sort of normality and enjoyment to residents during the Covid restrictions.

Easter Egg Hunt and Easter Bunny Visit

New for 2020 as the first Covid lockdown was introduced, the Parish Council arranged a very successful Covid safe Easter Egg Hunt around the village, with participants each receiving a visit from the Easter Bunny on Easter Sunday.

Rendlesham Community Radio

Rendlesham Community Radio came about as a result of the first lockdown in March 2020 with the aim to 'connect the community'. It has regular shows with more being added and supports all the Parish Council events, broadcasting live as well as offering opportunities to budding DJs.

Safer Rendlesham Project

The Council support the setting up of Neighbourhood Watch Schemes, and operate the Community Speedwatch Scheme. The Scheme has also been responsible for attracting the Police Mobile Speed Camera to the outskirts of the village in an attempt to slow down traffic along on the A1152. 2021 will see the installation of a Speed Indicator Device to raise awareness of speed and encourage safer driving.

Youth Group Charity

The Parish Council is the Charity Trustee of the Rendlesham Youth Group Charity. Junior sessions for the under 11s are held in the Community Centre every Tuesday during school term-time, and two senior sessions are held for the over 13s every Wednesday and Thursday term-time only. The sessions are constantly under review and change from time to time to suit the age groups using the youth services. Due to Covid, Youth Group sessions are currently suspended.

Get involved!

Have you thought about being a Parish Councillor?

Becoming a Parish Councillor is a great way to get involved with making a difference in the community. You can get involved with as much or as little as your other commitments allow and it is not a job for life! Councillors have a four year term of office. The next election year is 2023. This is a particularly exciting time for the Council with new events being added to work within current Covid restrictions as well as projects such as the 5-a-side football pitch and skatepark being designed, planned and delivered for everyone

To be eligible for the position of Councillor, you must (in summary):

- 1. Be over 18 and a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any other member state of the European Union, and meet at least one of the following four qualifications:
- a. You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish
- b. You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish during the whole of the last 12 months
- c. Your main or only place of work during the last 12 months has been in the parish
- d. You have lived in the parish, or within three miles of it, during the whole of the last 12 months
- 2. Not be disqualified. Disqualification means one or more of the following:
- a. You are employed by the parish council
- b. You are the subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim
- c. You have been sentenced to a term of imprisonment of three months or more (including a suspended sentence), without the option of a fine, during the last five years
- d. You have been disqualified from acting as a parish councillor - for certain offences to do with failure to disclose disclosable interests or corrupt or illegal electoral practices.

Reporting anti-social behaviour

If you are experiencing anti-social behaviour in the village please report it in the first instance to the police by phoning 101, ideally as it's occurring or as soon as possible afterwards.

The Parish Council would also welcome feedback on incidents of anti-social behaviour. Please send us date, time and as much detail of the incident as possible. Email admin@rendleshampc.org.uk

If you see dog mess on a pavement call the Parish Council on 01394 420207 or email us at admin@rendleshampc.org.uk giving us the exact location (eg nearest house number and road) of where the fouling has occurred and we will ensure that the incident is reported to Suffolk Coastal District Council.



Climate Emergency Working Group

In the early months of 2020 (remember them?) Rendlesham's Climate Emergency Working Group were working hard, long into cold and very dark evenings to put together an Action Plan that would deliver a set of Climate goals. The plan was to hold a fantastic event for all the residents of Rendlesham with bee house making, delicious catering and a chance for us all to have a good chat about the environmental future of the village.

Unfortunately we all know what happened then, personally although this project was a

chronic annoying itch that was impossible to scratch it had to be relegated in my priority league table for a while to simply mentally process the realities of a global pandemic. We did manage to complete the draft Plan AND get it through the doors of residents

So where are we now, nearly a year later? A renewed energy for this project in the final months of 2020 means that the consultation process is complete and plans are in place to finalise and present the Plan to the Parish Council in the hopes of achieving the end goal, formal adoption into policy. Not quite where we wanted to be as we move into another year but all things considered, we can't complain. I'm reminded of this whenever I talk to other Community Action Groups, other Parish Councils, Environmental Groups and Local Authorities. In fact, Rendlesham is a leader in this area, ahead of the game when it comes to a formal set of goals and targets for carbon reduction and nature restoration, ahead of the game on regular community litter picks and ahead on preparing the village for a concentrated effort for the next 10 years of tackling the climate and ecological emergencies we face.

As the second lockdown was announced we nearly cancelled the scheduled litter pick but a bit of quick and clever thinking allowed it to go ahead. You can read more about this in previous newsletters but the outcome thanks to YOUR feedback is a monthly litter picking day. Regular community events to improve our local environment are a big achievement, we should all be very proud.

Rendlesham is ahead of the game when it comes to a formal set of goals and targets for carbon reduction and nature restoration, ahead of the game on regular community litter picks and ahead on preparing the village for a concentrated effort for the next 10 years of tackling the climate and ecological emergencies we face.



Another Covid 19 consequence for many has been a greater appreciation of nature and in particular birds, when our liberties were curtailed their freedom on the wing seemed to inspire and comfort. It was suggested to me that Rendlesham should have a community bird feeding station, what a great idea I thought and began to research. What I found was.....very little. Yet again, Rendlesham's creativity and drive to make tangible positive changes has been on show and the relevant Committee's have agreed that a Community Bird Feeding Station can be erected in the Mayhew Road park. If you have any design ideas please share them! You can send any input to vproctor.rpccllr@gmail. com Look out for work beginning on this in the new year and we will also be reaching out to community groups to help look after, maintain and monitor the station and it's visitors, lot's of exciting citizen science opportunities ahead!

The work of the Climate Emergency Working Group has been really well supported by our County Councillor Alexander Nicoll who suggested we might explore funding to have an Electric Vehicle charging point installed in the village. I'm pleased to say that there has been significant progress with this, both from a funding point of view and a practical one and we hope for more good news early in

If you have been keeping up to speed with village news you will know that there is now the potential for allotments in Rendlesham. This is very much dependent on future planning decisions and a lesson we have learned from 2020 is not to assume too much about what the future holds but the Working Group are active in trying to make sure that when this part of the Neighbourhood Plan is delivered it happens in a democratic way and we are ready to hit the

All in all I think we can count our response to the Climate Emergency declaration as very impressive. I've always had a belief that the original and quirky nature of Rendlesham as a village means it has the will and the ability to be a local trail blazer and we are making that a reality. Our work is being recognised by other villages and towns and our experiences and opinions are being sought by county wide decision makers. If you want to be a part of this dynamic, friendly and action focused group you will be very welcome! Look out for dates of our next meeting! Victoria Proctor

Census 2021

Households across Rendlesham will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021

The census is a once-in-adecade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

It will be the first run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets.

"A successful census will ensure everyone from local government to charities can put services and funding in

the places where they are most needed," Iain Bell, deputy national statistician at the Office for National Statistics, said.

"This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, schools and new transport routes. That's why it is so important everyone takes part and we have made it easier for people to do so online on any device, with help and paper questionnaires for those that need them."

Census day will be on March 21. but households across the country will receive letters with online codes allowing them to take part from early March.

The census will include questions about your sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity. And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years, kept safe for future generations.



Bentwaters Cold War Museum

Bentwaters Cold War Museum opened its doors to the public in 2007, but its origins began in 2003 when a group of like-minded aviation enthusiasts got to together in the former USAF command post on RAF Bentwaters to form the Bentwaters Aviation Society.

Building 134, Bentwaters Parks, Rendlesham, Woodbridge, Suffolk IP12 2TW Built in 1943, the base was called RAF Bentwaters as it was owned by the Ministry of Defence and therefore part of the RAF. However, in 1951 it was handed over to the United States Air Force (USAF) for operational use which continued through to 1993 when it closed.

Throughout that period a great many of those with an interest in aviation and in particular fast jets that served in the USAF, would visit the base either on the many Open Days that the Americans held or just to stand by the fence to watch and photograph the very busy flying days.

The Bentwaters Aviation
Society is a registered charity
with about 200 members from
across the world including many
in the USA who are veterans
who served in the USAF.
The charity is the support
organisation for the museum
and provides both the financial
upkeep and the volunteers
necessary to maintain it.

There is a board of trustees and about 20 volunteers of all ages and aptitudes. The museum has both internal displays in the former command post and in the external compound a number of aircraft exhibits.

Memorabilia and information boards tell the story of the base, along with nearby RAF Woodbridge which has a similar history. Creating the displays and recording the history of one of the largest bases in the USAF over such a long period is a huge task. Acquiring airframes and restoring them is also a major undertaking requiring special skills. But there is plenty of room for those who want to learn and who want to do any number of the tasks that a museum requires to operate.

The museum is fortunate to have the support of the airfield owners, Bentwaters Parks.

Owned by the Kemball family,

who originally farmed part of the land the base was built on, Bentwaters Parks were instrumental in instigating the museum, providing the location, and have continued to help including the use of a Hardened Aircraft Shelter (HAS - one of the curved roof hangars that are spread across the airfield).

Of special note is the way the

base has remained mainly intact. Many former RAF and USAF bases have all but been erased by housing developments or returned to agricultural use. Fortunately the Kemball family have a great interest in history and had participated in the Anglo-American activities while the base was open. Many of the buildings are much as they were when the base closed, most are in use for businesses, many signs are still in place, the feel of the base remains clearly military. With a fully functioning runway, it is still all about flying.

The volunteers who work at the museum come from all walks of life. Youngsters who were not even born when the base was open, retired enthusiasts and American service personnel who have a life-long passion for the base.

So what goes on at the museum, which for Rendlesham residents might be a mystery?

It opens from Easter to the end of October, two Sundays a month and Bank Holiday Sundays and Mondays. Visitors are welcomed by volunteers and given a brief overview and left to walk around the exhibits at their leisure. If the weather is poor, the Command Post, being a bunker with three foot thick walls, provides immunity from all the UK can throw at it!

Displays cover the history in the form of high quality models and every aspect of base life is shown on information boards and display items. Though most rooms have been modified for museum purposes, the highlight is the rooms that have been restored to their original operational use as a command and control centre for the 81st Tactical Fighter Wing that operated over one hundred A-10 Thunderbolt attack aircraft, the largest single wing in post war USAF history. The bunker has an eerie Cold War atmosphere and it takes little to immerse yourself in what would have happened at the height of the conflict.

Volunteers are at hand to assist visitors and provide information and anecdotes of the story of the base. Often veterans visit to bring the sound of an American voice back to the rooms. A volunteer on regular duty is MSgt Bob Hale who served in the Command Post and gives talks throughout the day, captivating his audience with his knowledge.

Outside, the aircraft are proudly displayed with those completed recognised as of the highest of standards. The jewel in the crown is the A-10 Thunderbolt (or Warthog as it is affectionately known)

which took 13 years of lobbying the USAF to acquire on loan and a further year of restoration. Preparing the A-10 for transit and transporting it by special convoy with a police escort was a huge task for the volunteers. When it was unveiled to a specially invited audience of veterans and supporters, the highest of compliments was given by the last Wing Commander at the base, Brigidier General Roger Radcliffe who flew over from the US especially for the ceremony. With his hand on the nose of the "Hog" he said "they didn't come out of the factory this good!"


Whether it's creating displays, researching the history, working on the archives, cleaning exhibits, managing the paperwork and back office, repairing the buildings, cutting the grass, working in the café/shop, on duty on open days or working on aircraft and vehicles, there is much to do for the volunteers. It all adds up to a great experience for visitors and keeps the memory of the base alive for future generations. *Simon Gladas*

The draft document includes guidance on extensions and alterations to a historic building, replacing windows, doors and porches and development within the setting of a historic building.


