PUBLIC FORUM – 15 minutes

Present:

A member of the public asked about the Jubilee tree planting in Jubilee Park. Victoria Proctor explained the project. They wanted to register his objection to the scheme as the trees planted along the path would be detrimental to the safety of people walking the path in the dark. Victoria Proctor explained that the trees would be 6-8ft tall and 6m apart, and 2m from the path. The resident continued to express concern about children learning to ride bikes on the path and the danger that they would ride into the trees.

Mike Stevenson explained that there are plans to install a perimeter path around Jubilee Park. Dave Moore explained that the crown size of the trees selected had been carefully selected.

The member of the public expressed further concern about the leaves from trees falling on the path, having wet leaves on the path would be dangerous. Victoria Proctor explained that the scheme had been carefully considered and it was noted that the Park Keeper had a leaf blower. They also raised concern about tree roots coming through the path causing bumps. Victoria Proctor explained that the trees had been carefully chosen with expert advice on the type and size of trees.

Whilst the member of the public stated that people were against the idea, it was noted that the Parish Council had not received any other correspondence against the project.

It was emphasised that the Parish Council welcomed

Peter Wyartt stated that he owed it to all fellow Parish Councillors that due to health matters he offered his resignation from the Parish Council with immediate effect. The Council thanked Peter Wyartt for all his efforts over the year.

3. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON:

There were two vacancies available. Two confirmed nominations had been received from Mandy Small and Victoria Waring. An overview of their reasons for joining the Council were presented. Mike Stevenson proposed the Council co-opt Mandy Small and Victoria Waring. Dave Moore seconded. **Agreed**.

5. TO CONSIDER DOGS ON LEADS IN JUBILEE PARK

Mike Stevenson explained that following the signs 'Please keep your dogs under control' there had been 2 incidents in Jubilee Park where dogs had been attacked in the park.

Options:

- A dedicated area for dogs eg Mayhew Road Pocket Park, former play area in Suffolk Drive.
- 2. Leave things as they are.
- 3. Have set periods of time in the park for dogs.
- 4. Encourage people to report incidents of dogs out of control.

- 5. Article in the magazine stating the consequences for dogs out of control, including the legislation. Aimed at dog walkers in Jubilee Park.
- 6. Raise awareness with dog owners in the park.

Agreed to put an article in the magazine.

Action: Victoria Waring to write an article for the magazine.

The Clerk reported that there had been no success. With this in mind it was **agreed** not to pursue this, however, members of the public were always welcome to write in with any issues they wanted to raise with the Council.

- b) Anti-Social Behaviour Mike Parry There had been no reports of ASB from the public. The next ASB meeting is on 20 January 2022. It was noted that there were comments on Facebook about mopeds.

11. RENDLESHAM SKATEPARK

To request the allocation of CIL funds to the Skatepark budget

The Clerk reported that following the successful receipt of planning permission for the skatepark, funding applications would be prepared in the next month. The Jubilee Park budget allocation for the skatepark for 2022-2023 had been reduced from £25,000 to £7,000, with the thought that an application could be made for the shortfall of £18,000.

Mike Stevenson proposed that £18,000 of CIL funds held by the Parish Council is vired to the skatepark fund. Victoria Waring seconded. 7 in favour, 0 against, 2 abstentions.

The proposal was carried. It was agreed to vire £18,000 of CIL funds to the skatepark budget.
