## **PUBLIC FORUM – 15 minutes**

 County Councillor Report – Cllr Alexander Nicoll reported that he was dealing with mostly planning and highways, including sewer replacement in Yarmouth Road, Melton. Saddlemakers Lane has also been closed to prevent a rat run. Melton Parish Council are sponsoring a reduction in speed limit in Saddlemakers Lane. The same is being carried out between Wilford roundabout and Melton.

Potholes – currently working to be filled. There were concerns regarding the standard of the roads being built.

Cllr Nicoll left the meeting.

 District Councillor Report – Cllr Tim Wilson thanked Ray Herring for a smooth handover. 16 seats (Green party) + one independent now give the majority at the District Council. He has attended Butley and Tunstall Parish Council meetings so far and he looks forward to working with Rendlesham.

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## Other points:

Transition Streets – the final chapter in the magazine is in the June magazine. Hedgehog conservation project with a Nature First grant for £1,000. An event had been held about hedgehog awareness. 10 hedgehog houses have been built and highway notices. The plans have now been passed to the Scouts to construct more. Community Centre solar panels.

Noted that Dave Moore was going to Martlesham Parish Council to talk about repair sheds.
